REGARDLESS OF IMMIGRATION STATUS

What is State Husky A and State Husky B?

These programs cover uninsured children (ages 0 to 12) with household income between 0 to 323% of the federal poverty level.

Who is eligible?

Children must:

- Be 0-12 years old
- Not have access to affordable insurance
- Be non-citizens who do not qualify for Husky Medicaid or Husky B CHIP due to immigration status

If a child was enrolled in the program prior to age 13 they may be eligible for coverage through the age of 18.

How much does it cost?

State HUSKY A

Free. No premium, copayments or other cost sharing.

Receive same level of benefits as Husky A Medicaid enrollee.

State HUSKY B - Band 1

No premium.

May have small copayments.

State HUSKY B - Band 2

Monthly premium. \$30 for one child or \$50 for two or more children.

Small copayments for non routine services and some other cost sharing.

What do I need to sign up?

1. Names and date of birth of all people in the household
2. Proof of CT address
3. Household income, including frequency and source. (For verification, you can use paychecks or a letter from your employer.)

If eligible, you will be given a 90-day, post enrollment, reasonable opportunity period to send in verification document(s).
