REGARDLESS OF IMMIGRATION STATUS

What is State Husky A and State Husky B?

These programs cover uninsured children (ages 0 to 12) with household income between 0 to 323% of the federal poverty level.

Who is eligible?

Children must:

- Be 0-12 years old
- · Not have access to affordable insurance
- Be non-citizens who do not qualify for Husky Medicaid or Husky B CHIP due to immigration status

If a child was enrolled in the program prior to age 13 they may be eligible for coverage through the age of 18.

How much does it cost?

State HUSKY A

Free. No premium, copayments or other cost sharing.

Receive same level of benefits as Husky A Medicaid enrollee.

What do I need to sign up?

- Names and date of birth of all people in the household
- 2. Proof of CT address
- 3. Household income, including frequency and source. (For verification, you can use paychecks or a letter from your employer.)

If eligible, you will be given a 90-day, post enrollment, reasonable opportunity period to send in verification document(s).

State HUSKY B

- Band 1

May have small copayments.

State HUSKY B
- Band 2

Monthly premium. \$30 for one child or \$50 for two or more children. Small copayments for non routine services and some other cost sharing.

What is the income eligibility limit?


